
Where two special rivers – the Rainbow and Withlacoochee-plus Florida's second largest artesian spring combine into a "wanderland"



### A (19M) Marjorie Harris Carr Cross-Florida Greenway, Rainbow Springs Campground, **Rainbow Springs State Park**

Crossing the Withlacoochee River at the Citrus/Marion County line, continue on US 41 to the City of Dunnellon. To access the Marjorie Harris Carr Cross-Florida Greenway, turn east (R) on CR 484 (E. Pennsylvania Ave.) past countryside dotted by huge spreading oaks, to the Pruitt Trailhead (15410 SW CR 484).

- 110-mile corridor for equestrian, biking, and hiking use.
- From the Gulf of Mexico to the St. Johns River, this greenway occupies land formerly known as the Cross-Florida Barge Canal.



Return west on CR 484 toward Dunnellon to SW 180th Ave. Turn north (R) through hilly pastureland. Rainbow Springs Campground is on the left.

- Canoe and tube rentals.
- 105 campsites, swimming pool, fishing pier, picnic tables, grills, playground, dock.

Continue north to intersection with US 40. Turn west (L) to intersection with US 41. Turn south (L) for 1/2 mile to Rainbow Springs State Park.

- Scenic gardens, waterfalls, nature trails, wildlife viewing.
- facilities, canoeing.

## • Swimming, snorkeling, picnic

#### B (10M) K-P Hole County Park, **Dunnellon City Beach, Centen**nial Park

Return south on US 41 to stoplight at SW 99th Pl., turn east (L), cross railroad tracks and north (L) onto SW 190th Ave. to K-P Hole County Park on the Rainbow River.

- Swimming, picnicking, playground.
- Canoe & tube rentals.

Return to US 41 south, turn south (L) at CR 484 (Pennsylvania Ave.) four blocks to Maple, turn south (R), follow signs to Dunnellon City Beach.

- Confluence of Rainbow and Withlacoochee Rivers.
- Swimming, picnic tables, grills, playground.

Return to CR 484 west (L), at US 41 turn south (L). Before bridge over the Withlacoochee, turn right into Centennial Park.

- Boat ramp, canoe access to river.
- Picnic tables, boardwalk, gazebo.

### C (6M) Historic Dunnellon

To visit Historic Dunnellon, return north on US 41, turn west (L) at Pennsylvania Ave., and then north (R) at Cedar St. (CR 40).

- Restored nineteenth century homes and buildings.
- Antique stores, novelty shops, restaurants.

Continue west on Cedar (CR 40) to Levy County.
